11:00 Session 2: The Korean Peninsula and Denuclearization

This session will examine the status of denuclearization talks on the Korean Peninsula. What are the respective parties' assessments of recent developments? What are the prospects for renewed multilateral discussions over the nuclear issue? Should the Six-Party Talks be resumed? What can be done to improve the negotiating process?

This session will look at the role of counterproliferation initiatives, with a specific focus on the Proliferation Security Initiative (PSI) and the Global Initiative to Combat Nuclear Terrorism (GICNT)? How has PSI evolved since its inception? What is its legal authority? What activities have taken place in the Asia-Pacific as part of PSI? What impact has the lack of an organizational

structure had on the initiative? How does the GICNT compare with the PSI? What are the main activities associated with GICNT? What is its legal basis? How is it organized? How can the PSI, the GICNT, and other similar initiatives be made more effective to combat proliferation threats?

15:30 Session 4: The Comprehensive Nuclear Test Ban Treaty

This session will focus on the Comprehensive Nuclear Test Ban Treaty (CTBT). What are the main components of the regime? What is the status of the Treaty's verification regime? What impact would entry into force have on the verification regime? What is the current status of treaty implementation in the Asia-Pacific? Are national and regional capacities adequate to implement obligations outlined in the Treaty? What are the obstacles to universalization of the Treaty? How can these obstacles be overcome?

9:15 **Session 5: Nuclear Safeguards**

This session will examine the roles of nuclear safeguards in the Asia-Pacific region. What are the relationships between comprehensive safeguards agreements, small quantities protocols, and additional protocols? What are their respective functions? How do they complement one another, both legally and technically? What are the loopholes and how can they be overcome? What is the relationship between safeguards and nuclear security? What is the status of safeguard adherence in the Asia-Pacific? What are the concerns of states that are not adhering to or have not fully implemented nuclear safeguards? How can these concerns be addressed?

11:00 Session 6: Nuclear Security

This session will examine nuclear security. What conventions, rules, and standards have been developed to address nuclear security? What is the appropriate scope of nuclear security? Should it be broader than security of special nuclear materials? Why? What is the relationship between nuclear security and nuclear safety? What are the main outcomes of the Seoul Nuclear Security Summit? What are the next steps for the nuclear security agenda in anticipation of the 2014 Nuclear Security Summit in the Netherlands? To what extent has nuclear security been addressed in the Asia-Pacific region?

13:45 **Session 7: Biosecurity in the Asia-Pacific**

This session will examine biosecurity in the Asia-Pacific. What provisions in the Biological and Toxin Weapons Convention (BTWC) address biosecurity? Are they adequate? How is biosecurity being addressed in the inter-sessional process? How have recent advances in biological sciences changed security requirements associated with biological research facilities? What is being

done to ensure proper security at these research facilities? What is being done to address the physical security of biological pathogens? What is the relationship between biosecurity and biosafety? How is biosecurity being addressed in the Asia-Pacific? How can Asia contribute constructively to the interim inter-sessional process of the BTWC?

This session will focus on future work of the Study Group. What is the status of CSCAP Memoranda? How should the Study Group focus its future efforts?
